

A rare study of a unique group. Disillusioned by their failures in Indo-China and their betrayal by De Gaulle on an independent Algeria, disaffected soldiers and French Algerians engage in a ruthless and hopeless campaign of terror against both sides of the conflict. A unique and intimate look (the author interviewed most of the surviving members of the OAS for the book) into the makeup and breakdown of a terrorist/criminal organization.

This book remains relevant today, as the US struggles to defeat an insurgent that makes war not only on those it considers foreign invaders, but on it's own people as well.
